- The Stephen J. Brady Stop Hunger Scholarships:** This scholarship recognizes and rewards students who have made a significant impact in the fight against hunger. Recipients will each receive \$5,000 as well as a matching grant in their name for the hunger-related charity of their choice. Applicant must have demonstrated on-going commitment to their community by performing unpaid volunteer services impacting hunger in the U.S. at least within the last 12 months. - Gwinnett County Public Schools (GCPS) Foundation Scholarships:** The GCPS Foundation has proudly awarded over \$475,000 in student scholarships to graduating seniors. - Greenhouse Scholars:** This unique scholarship program is for low income students. We seek students who are academically driven, exceptional leaders, and compelled to help their communities. Eligibility: Graduating senior, U.S. citizen or permanent resident, minimum GPA 3.5, demonstrated financial need (annual household income no greater than \$70,000), possess excellent leadership skills, an ability to persevere through difficult circumstances, and a strong interest and commitment to their community. - Ron Brown Scholar Program:** This program seeks to identify African-American seniors who make significant contributions to society. Applicants must excel academically, exhibit exceptional leadership potential, participate in community service activities and demonstrate financial need. Each year, a minimum of ten students will be designated Ron Brown Scholars and will receive \$10,000 annually for four years, for a total of \$40,000. - Asian and Pacific Islander American Scholarship Fund (APIASF):** Current high school seniors on track to graduate in May and planning to attend college in the fall are encouraged to apply.
