Final Transcripts:

We are now accepting final transcript requests. Every senior planning to attend college in the Fall will need to come to the Career Room and fill out a BLUE Request Form and pay your \$5.00. You will also have to provide your school's address. These will be sent out after graduation. Student athletes who filed the NCAA Clearinghouse eligibility form earlier in the year must request a final transcript to be sent to them also. College/University's **will not** allow freshmen to register for 2nd semester classes without a "final transcript" from the high school!

Perfect Attendance:

College-Bound Broncos:

Seniors who have chosen and been accepted to the college they will attend, come by A36 and put your name on the clip board by the TV so that we can post your information on the "College-Bound Bronco" wall. Selective Service System (SSS) Registration:

Males are required to register with SSS within 30 days of their 18 birthday. If a young man reaches age 26 without registering, he can be **PERMANENTLY BARRED** from ever receiving: Federal student loans, Placement in a federal job training program, eligibility for a job with the federal government, a driver's license or license renewal in most states. In addition, male immigrants who wish to become citizens can face significant delays if they fail to register by age 26. **Register Today: Visit www.sss.gov !**

Electronic Transcripts:

You can request electronic transcripts through www.GAFutures.org. Electronic transcripts are available for most schools in Georgia and they are FREE.

Paper Transcripts:

It is the responsibility of each student to mail his/her transcripts. Students requesting transcripts must complete a form in the Counseling Office stating the number of transcripts needed. Each transcript will be "officially" sealed in an envelope that must not be opened by the student for it to remain official. The cost is \$5.00 for each. Please allow 3-5 days for completion of your request.
